

Appraisal Report of the Expert Committee on Review of the SIA and SIMP Report for Land Acquisition of Tandur Bypass Road.

The appropriate Government/District collector has constituted an expert committee with an independent multidisciplinary Expert Group of members for appraisal of Social Impact Assessment report and Social Impact Management Plan for Tandur bypass Road project. The expert group consists of the following officials/ Non officials:

The Expert Group constituted under sub-section (1) of section 7 of the Act has evaluated the Social Impact Assessment report and made its recommendation. The following are points of the appraisal committee on the SIA/SIMP report of Tandur Bypass Road Project.

Evaluation of SIA & SIMP Report for the Tandur By Pass Road Project:

It was observed from the SIA and SIMP report for the Tandur By Pass project prepared by the CMSR, Hyderabad that the acquisition of land and properties have been necessitated for safe and efficient movement of Traffic.

The Tandur Bypass project is a long pending deram of the surrounding community. Approximately 12 Kms long proposed Tandur Bypass road runs through lands belonging to Yalal and Tandur mandals of Vikarabad District. Major villages across the project sketch are kokat and Rasulpura in Yalal Mandal and Antaram and Chengole in Tandur Mandal. the land from these villages for the project is proposed to be acquired as per the RFCTLARR, Act 2013. the project involves acquisition of lands to the extent of 99.28 ½ acres across 4 villges situated in Yalal and Tandur mandals. The detailed estimate for the Tandur bypass road from Km 0/0 to 12/791 is sanctioned by the Government of Telangana under plan work of widening roads to double lande road vide G.O.Rt.No.130, Dt: 27.11.2014. Th e estimated approximate cost of the project is Rs.75.00 Crores.

The report says “the estimated numbers of families being affected are about 189 PAFs are loosing their agriculture land and no community properties are effected.

This report however provides the information of the 160 PAFs. Remaining 29 families were not available in the villages while collecting the data. This helps in working out the entitlements, compensation and rehabilitation package. This helps in working out the compensation for entitlement and rehabilitation package.

Recommendations and Observations of the Committee:

The committee members have been elaborately discussed on the SIA report & PPT submitted by the CMSR and recommended the following.

1. The Project is proposed for public purpose.
2. Committee has recommended the District Administrations to explore the possibilities to allot alternate Government lands near by the land proposed for acquisition to the Tribal community people who losing entire their agriculture lands in the proposed project.
3. Committee has recommended that the District Administrations to provide skill development trainings to the affected peoples in the project in their interested areas of work.
4. Committee has recommended that the District Administrations to avoid acquisition of agriculture bore wells. If it is not possible, to examine the technical feasibility to supply the water to them in an alternate mode of supply to enable them to cultivate their agriculture lands or pay compensation for digging of another borewell as the per the technical advise of Ground water department.
5. Committee requested the District administration to minimize the loss of Graveyards in the projects as much as possible.
6. Committee advised the CMSR through DRDO to incorporate the details of traffic assessment study carried out by the R&B department.
7. Committee advised the CMSR to incorporate the details of number of families becoming land less due to land acquisition in the report.

The SIA report is quite comprehensive and would act as a reference point for project action. The above details will also be helpful to the PAFs & PDFs to cross check their details when the SIA & SMP reports are made available to them in local language.

The appropriate Government/ District Collector to take a decision on above recommendation.


